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









A growing trend?

- 24 European countries,
- Over 700 Urban Vehicle Access Regulations (UVARs).







Why UVAR?

- Reduction of urban congestion.
- Reduction of emissions.
- Increased safety.
- Livability and attractiveness of the urban area.
- A source of income (?).
- Because carrots aren't enough.








Then what is behind UVAR that inspires such mixed feelings?

- Whilst city administrators can see UVAR as useful tools for a better city,
- A variety of stakeholders perceive them as ban and restrictions to their daily activities.






Replicating best practices is a "science"!

- to structure the way in which the mobility system accompanying access regulations should be approached,

- Combines desk research with empirical data and expert knowledge
- With on-the-field testing
- Through impact assessment and process evaluation


→ Tailored UVAR support and guidance
